Appalachia Spring Mission is a three night service opportunity for **College-Age Students** that provides hands-on experience in reaching out to community members in one of the region's poorest areas. Participants work alongside others in the community who may be less fortunate, always with respect for their dignity and the lessons they have to teach us. Participants will have the chance to work on a variety of projects.

Areas of Service:

Home Rehabilitation and Repair

Many people in the area live in mobile homes and older houses that often need repairs and critical updates. Working with contractors from Southern Indiana and the local Habitat for Humanity chapter, participants will not only learn new skills, but also ensure safe homes are available for needy families.



Thrift Shop and Food Bank

The Catholic Thrift Shop and Food Bank provide food and clothing to thousands of people throughout the county. Due to the high demand and limited local staff, volunteers are always needed to help in the sorting and distributing of items at both locations.

Support the Catholic Mission

The Good Shepherd Mission is more than a place for Catholics to worship. It serves as a community center for the broader area. Participants may be asked to creatively address the needs that are most pressing during the week they serve. This means being ready to lend a helping hand whenever and wherever it is needed.

Other Program Features:

- * A team approach that promotes youth learning and acting together on justice and service.
- * A chance to live a long weekend of simplicity with others in a community setting.
- * Creative opportunities for prayer, Eucharist, and learning about the needs of others
- * Opportunities to meet new friends, enjoy times of fun, games and laughter.
- * Experience of the natural beauty and rich culture of the Appalachian mountains.

We will be staying at Bethany Christian Mission Center, just 15 minutes from the Good Shepherd Mission.


Who can participate?

Community Profile



Wolfe County (est. population 7000) is nestled in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains. It is the poorest county in Kentucky, with over 35% of its residents living below the poverty line.

The Good Shepherd Catholic Mission, located in Campton, began in the 1970s with only three parishioners, growing to more than 70 members in 2009. The Sisters of St. Francis of Oldenburg staff the mission and dedicate themselves to serving the hundreds of needy persons in the community.

Their outreach efforts include collecting and distributing clothing, household items and food; partnering with Habitat for Humanity and Relay for Life; leading Bible studies, summer camps and vacation bible schools; providing home repairs and emergency assistance; educating community members on gardening, life skills, and parenting; and many other social and spiritual programs.
